| Alertness                     | The horse stands alert, neck raised and nostrils dilated, eyes wide open, and ears held stiffly without any perceptible perturbation in the environment.   |
| Backing away                  | The horse walks backwards at the sight of the stimulus.  |
| Blowing sounds                | Forceful expulsion of air through the nostrils associated with a loud snoring sound.   |
| Defecation                    | The horse expels feces with its tail raised.   |
| Gaze towards the door         | The horse stands still, with elevated neck, head, and ears oriented towards the door.  |
| Glances                       | The horse is looking at the stimulus with its eyes open.   |
| Immobility                    | The horse is awake and stands immobile without engaging in any behavioral activity or attention sustained.   |
| Orientation of the ears       | Both ears are oriented toward the stimulus.  |
| Outward alertness             | Stands alert, neck raised and nostrils dilated, eyes wide opened and ears held stiffly after hearing/seeing any stimulus in the environment (except the visual stimulus).                          |
| Raising head                  | The horse stands still, with an elevated neck.   |
| Running away                  | The horse trots or gallops at least 3 meters away.   |
| Scratching                    | The horse is standing, making small repetitive movements with one part of its body on an object in the environment.  |
| Sniffing the stimulus objects | The horse smells the stimulus objects with its nostrils in contact or less than 3cm from the surface, sometimes moving its head and neck within or towards the area of interest.                   |
| Sniffing other objects        | The horse smells its environment (sand, wall, or door), with its nostrils in contact or less than 3cm from the surface, sometimes moving its head and neck within or towards the area of interest. |
| Startled                      | The horse makes a sudden movement (jerking, the body suddenly contracting) when approaching the visual stimulus or the sudden or auditory stimulus appears.  |
| Stimulus gaze                 | The horse is standing with an elevated neck, the head, and ears oriented toward the stimulus.  |
| Stopping                      | The horse stops moving at the sight of the stimulus or when the sudden stimulus appears.   |
| Trotting                      | The horse moves at a trot without interaction or grazing.  |
| Turning around                | The horse turns away when the sudden stimulus appears or when hearing the auditory stimulus.   |
| Twitches                      | Muscular jerks that suddenly shake the horse's body.   |
